









GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION OF KIGOMA REGION



- Kigoma Region (marked yellow) is located on the Western part of Tanzania on the shores of Lake Tanganyika.
- > The Region covers 45,075 km²
 - land area covers 37,037 Km².
 (82%)
 - Water 8,038 Km² (18%)
- It lies between latitude 3.6° and 6.5° South and longitude 29.5° and 31.5° East.
- Shares borders with Burundi to the north and the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) on the west along Lake Tanganyika.





ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS AND POPULATION



- Administratively, the Region is subdivided into Six Districts namely; Buhigwe, Kakonko, Kasulu, Kibondo, Kigoma and Uvinza.
- The Region has 8 Local Government Authorities namely: Buhigwe, Kakonko, Kasulu, Kibondo, Kigoma and Uvinza District Coucils; Kasulu Town Council and Kigoma/Ujiji Municipal Council which is the headquaters of the region.
- Population: According to 2012 population census Kigoma Region had a population of 2,127,930 (female 1,098,936 and male 1,028,994) and growth rate stands at 2.4%. It is estimated that this year the regional population is 2,297,927.

CLIMATE

- Temperatures range between 20 and 30 degrees Centigrade.
- Annual rainfall ranges between 860 and 1200 mm.
- Rainfall pattern is uni-modal with the rain season lasting from October to May.

KIGOMA REGION ECONOMY

Regional Per Capita Income Growth:

In 2011 the per capita income of Kigoma Region was Tshs 817,398/=. By the year 2014 the per capita raised to Tshs 1,012,774/=.

The Regional economy mainly depends on the following productive sectors: -

- Agriculture—Is major economic activity in Kigoma employing more than 70% of the population
- Food and cash crops: Maize, Beans, cassava, banana, paddy, coffee, tobacco, sunflower, palm, etc.

KIGOMA REGION ECONOMY

- Kigoma is a net exporter to other regions and Neighboring Countries
- Food basket for neighbours: Mwanza, Shinyanga & Tabora regions as well as Burundi, Eastern DRC
- Natural resources –Fishing, Wildlife, forestry, beekeeping
- Tourism-Hotels, tour guiding and tourist sites.
- Trade and Industries Logistics Hub and Small and medium Scale Industries.



INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT



The government is taking various initiatives in order to open up the region, these include:

- Trunk roads upgrading- to link Kigoma with other regions with tarmac paved roads
 - Kigoma Tabora (to Dar es Salaam)
 - * Kigoma Burundi border 60 km upgrading completed to all weather tarmac road.
- Ports Rehabilitation- Tanzania Ports Authority is currently improving all major Ports along Lake Tanganyika.







- Central Railway line:
 - Upgrade of Kigoma-Dar es Salaam Central Railway line to standard gauge.
- Kigoma airport modernization and expansion:
 - Construction of Phase 1: widening of runway from 30m to 45m and tarmac 3.1km

- Private Commercial banks are looking for office accommodation to open branches in Kigoma Municipality.
- Local businessmen are investing in high quality boutique and hotels,
- The numbers of visitors looking for business opportunities in Kigoma is rising

PROPOSED FUTURE DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

- Free Port operations for Lake Transport
- Trade and Logistics Hub with a Dry Port serviced by railways and road systems;
- Free Trade Zone linked with a World Heritage Tourism Cluster (Ujiji World Heritage Site) linked to wildlife (Gombe and Mahale) and ecotourism;
- Export Processing Zone value addition and packaging for the Great Lakes region markets.
- Stand Alone Projects These are projects that will be implemented in the districts.



OPPORTUNITIES IN THE DISTRICTS



There are investment opportunities in all districts in Kigoma Region.

Kasulu and Buhigwe Districts:

- Agricultural area at Kigadye 200,000 ha.
- Makere Lime, Gold and Coal Deposit in Kasulu
- Sugar cane plantation: Malagarasi River Basin 24,838 ha

Kibondo and Kakonko Districts:

- Gold deposit exploration: Four villages, have estimated area of 240,000m² of Gold deposit.
- Large deposits of Kaolinite: Found at Kasuga village (Kakonko).
- Coal survey and exploration: Kasanda, Kibuye (Kakonko) and Kichananga villages in Kibondo.
- limestone deposits Kumwambu Ward and Kitahana village (Kibondo) - area of more than 5 ha.

Kigoma and Uvinza Districts

- Agricultural Area of 13,000ha in Lugufu and Basanza Villages;
- Mining Copper, Galena, Lime and Platinum deposits (more than 103,202 ha)
- Lake Transportation:
 - *Kigoma port is expected to cater for the increased passengers and goods haulage by steamer to the Great Lakes Nations.
 - There is a potential of developing a new free port at Kaseke within the Kigoma Special Economic Zone



KIGOMA SPECIAL ECONOMIC ZONE (KISEZ)



- Strategically located 15 minutes drive from Kigoma town,
- KiSEZ is thought to be a world-class business hub and a vehicle for industrial growth and development.
- ➤ The KiSEZ will provide a cutting-edge technology and customer focus and it will offer support services to investors in a cost-effective, trouble-free and customer-friendly environment.


KIGOMA SPECIAL ECONOMIC ZONE

- Government endorsed and support Kigoma SEZ Development.
- Master Plan for land use and zoning of Kigoma urban development approved by Ministry of Lands. The plan consist of the following clusters:
 - Manufacturing: Production, assembling plants, gowdowns
 - Residential: Mult-storey buildings for residential accommodation,
 - Institutional: Schools, colleges, universities and Hospitals
 - Trade: Banks, malls, super markets and hotels
 - Recreational: Stadiums, clubs, parks and halls
 - Transport: Ports, airport, railways, bus and HDV terminals

KIGOMA SPECIAL ECONOMIC ZONE

Achievement:

- About 20,000ha have been earmarked for SEZ,
- Feasibility study, master plan and Environmental and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) done,
- Survey done for 691ha and 401 plots demarcated
- Valuation for properties in phase I project area completed and compensation done to 399 people,
- Preparation of line infrastructure drawings for roads, water, electricity, storm water and sewerage and BOQs done.

Way Forward:

- Construction of Line infrastructure power, water and roads
- Construction of Administration block (one stop centre)
- Promotional activities

 - Reducing cost of production (power, water, communication, transport)
 - Take deliberate measures to uplift skills
